Nottingham Hebrew Congregation, Shakespeare Street, NG1 (Wesleyan Methodist Chapel by Thomas Simpson 1854. Synagogue 1954. Contains Ark from former Chaucer Street Synagogue 1890)

Note: All buildings are purpose-built and in use as synagogue/Jewish communal facility unless otherwise indicated. Converted Victorian churches, chapels or industrial schools used as synagogues are excluded from this list - two 18th-century chapels in London are, however, included. Private residences built or occupied by Jews are omitted, except in the case of Mediaeval structures, which are listed separately.
